Group classes which will include the opportunity for individualized instruction will be followed by instructor-led group critique. Individuals going solo, or groups from local art societies are welcome to attend.

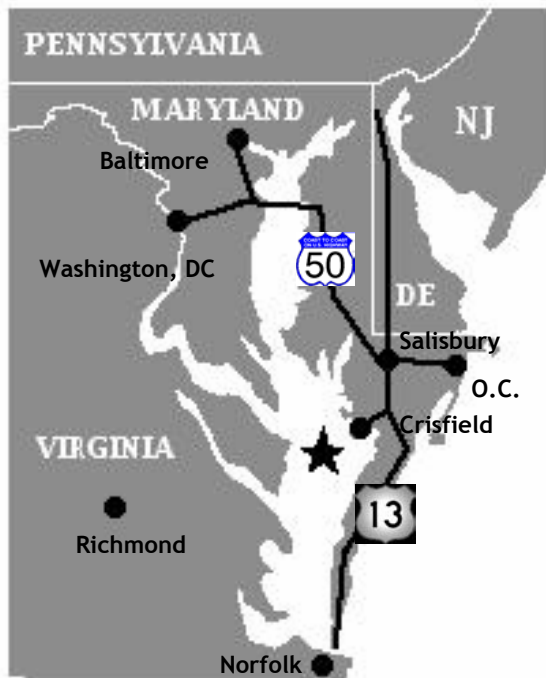

About Smith Island

Scenic Smith Island, Maryland sits in the heart of the Chesapeake Bay, surrounded by water and natural beauty. A birdwatcher's paradise, Smith Island is home to a wide variety of birds inhabiting trees and marshes, including: blue herons, snowy egrets, cormorants, ducks, loons, osprey, falcons, terns, sea gulls and even pelicans.

The residents of Smith Island, the only inhabited island in the Chesapeake not reachable by bridge, carry on a traditional life based upon crabbing and oystering. Arriving by ferry is like traveling to "an island out of time," where the pace of life known to our ancestors carries on.

Smith Island is only accessible by boat. If you are driving, plan to leave your car at the ferry site. To check ferry times, which change each season, call or check our website.
